575 students from across the country, he received 4th Place in the Supplemental Debate event. John is the first student in GHS Debate & Forensics history to be recognized on the National Tournament stage. More than 3,200 students, across the country, participated in the event.

The GHS Debate & Forensics team (led by GHS teacher Ken Yunker) has been represented at each of the last nine NFL National Tournaments (one of only five schools within their qualifying district to achieve this). The NFL, www.nflonline.org, mission is to promote high school & middle school speech & debate activities as a means to develop a student's essential life skills and values.

GHS State Track Championship

The Grandview High School Boy's Track & Field Team claimed the Class 3 State Team Championship at the 2011 Missouri State High School Activities Association (MSHSAA) Track and Field Championships held on May 27-28 in Jefferson City, Missouri. This was the first GHS state track championship since 1990 and the second in GHS history. Additionally, GHS Junior Dee Dee Blow finished 3rd in the Girl's Discus competition at the same event.

Highlights of the Boy's championship included:

Romy Reaws (Senior), First Place in Pole Vault (14'-6"—a GHS record for the second time); Dapo Akinmoladun (Junior), First Place 300 meter hurdles and Second Place 110 meter hurdles and 4x200 meter relay; Cliff Scott (Senior), medaled in open 100 and 200 meter dash, and 4x100 and 4x200 meter relay; Jaron Alexander (Junior),

Math Benchmarks Designed To Enhance Student Achievement

Approximately 25 district teachers (grades 5-12) spent the week of June 13th-17th at Grandview High School working collaboratively to design math benchmarks around the Missouri Grade/Course Level Expectations (commonly referred to as GLEs/CLEs) and the district Math Power Standards. Math benchmarking is a process where teachers identified those math concepts and skills students must master at each grade level/course, followed by the development of the actual benchmarks (mini common assessments), which indicate students' mastery of the skills and concepts. Once developed, the teachers ordered the math benchmarks and developed a pacing calendar which will be used in every Grandview C-4 school. The benchmarks were clustered into "scrimmages" (more comprehensive common

assessments), which students take approximately every 2 weeks. Scrimmages require students to move from skill acquisition to applying their knowledge through the completion of more rigorous and complex problems. They are also designed to "spiral" the learning, to ensure that previously mastered skills and concepts are retained in students' long-term memory.

GHS teachers who give the EOC (End of Course) exams have been participating in math benchmarking for the past 3 years. Extending the math benchmarking down through the middle schools and into the 5th grade is a huge step in ensuring every student at GC-4 has a consistent experience, regardless of their school or classroom teacher assignment. As a result of implementing this anchor strategy, a common assessment format, language, pacing calendar, and grading system will now be used in the math content area for all students in grades 5-12. This initiative moves GC-4 to implementing a guaranteed and viable curriculum for every student, which will result in students exiting high school with the necessary college and career readiness skills. Many districts implementing this initiative have seen tremendous academic gains, and GC-4 teachers and administration believes this work will have a positive impact on student achievement levels.

This curriculum work was supported through collaborative efforts between the district Curriculum & Instruction (C & I) department and the PREP-KC organization. GC-4 is currently in the process of scheduling ongoing collaborative curriculum release days throughout the 2011-12 school year, where teachers across multiple grade levels will come together and use student achievement data to refine their teaching and students' learning around math.

Transition Day Is August 10

Transition Day will be held on Wednesday, August 10, for incoming 6th and 9th graders for the 2011-12 school year. It will be a half-day event providing students an opportunity to meet the school staff, receive an overview of their classes, and take a tour of their new middle or

high school surroundings at the Center for Alternative Instructional Resources (CAIR), Grandview Middle School, Martin City K-8, and Grandview High School. The schedule will include fun and meaningful activities for all new students.

Breakfast and lunch will be offered for purchase at school cafeteria prices. The Transition Day schedule will be 7:00-11:15 am (CAIR), 8:15 am-12:15 pm (Martin City K-8), 8:00 am-12:15 pm (Grandview Middle) and 7:20-11:35 am (Grandview High School).

2011-2012 Residency Requirements

Grandview C-4 School District will begin enrollment for the 2011-2012 school year on Monday, July 25, 2011 (elementary and Martin City K-8 schools), Tuesday, July 26, 2011 (CAIR and Grandview High School) and Monday, August 1, 2011 (Grandview Middle School). Verification of residency within the Grandview C-4 district is required for all students (returning and new) enrolling.

If you own or rent/lease property within the Grandview C-4 district, the following documentation must be presented at your school to verify residency:

- Current mortgage coupon or rental/lease agreement with landlord information and signature.
- Two current utility bills (gas, electricity, water, telephone or cable) in the resident’s name, which are no more than 30 days old; no final or disconnect notices will be accepted.
- If enrolling a student as a custodial guardian, you must provide court documentation or a letter of placement by a Social Services agency as proof of guardianship.

If you reside with someone who owns or rents/leases property within the Grandview C-4 district, an Affidavit of Residency will be required. In addition to completing the affidavit forms, the following documentation will be needed by the Grandview C-4 resident and the parent/legal guardian to verify residency:

The Grandview C-4 Resident must provide:

- Current mortgage coupon or rental/lease agreement with landlord information and signature. If additional residents are not listed on the lease, you must provide a letter from the apartment manager, on letterhead, acknowledging their presence.
- Two current utility bills (gas, electricity, water, telephone or cable) in the resident’s name, which are no more than 30 days old; no final or disconnect notices will be accepted.
- Photo identification – for notary purposes.

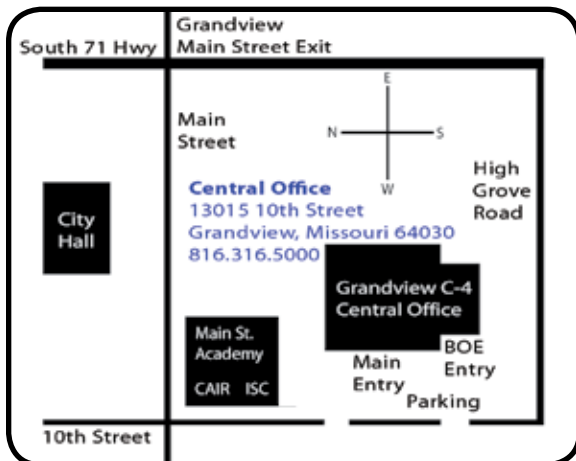
The Parent/Legal Guardian of the Student must provide:

- Proof of residency – examples include pay stub, bank statement, medical receipt, utility bill, personal property receipt, government agency paperwork.
- Photo identification – for notary purposes.

Affidavits of Residency must be processed at the District’s Central Office located at 13015 10th Street, Grandview, Missouri, from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm Monday through Friday. To coincide with extended enrollment hours at various schools, the Central Office will have extended hours as follows:

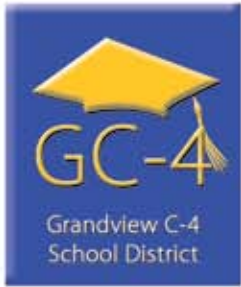

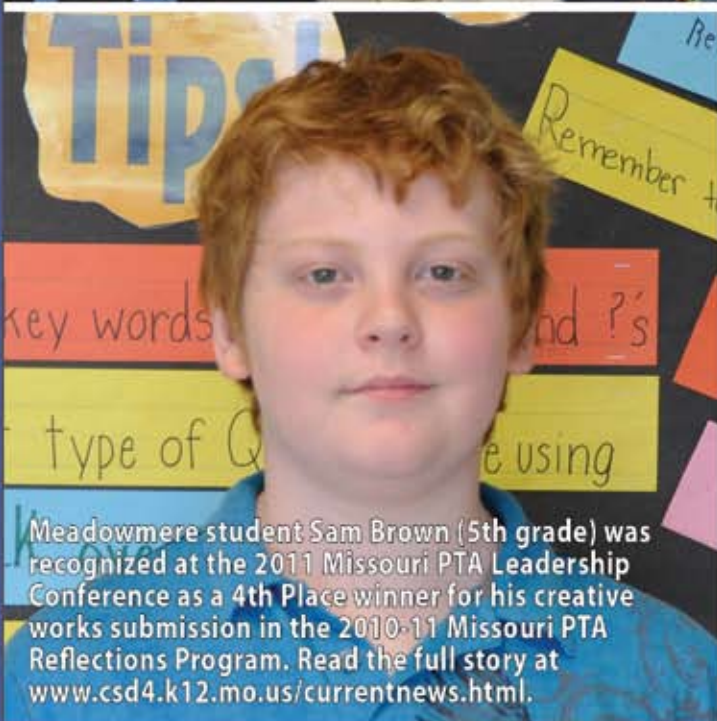
